


La Conquistadora, Santa Fe, New Mexico

La Conquistadora Our Lady of Peace

This beautiful wooden statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary has had many names. According to tradition, the statue was brought from Spain to Mexico in the early 1600s and then to New Mexico in 1625. The name of the villa church in Santa Fe was Our Lady of the Assumption, and the statue was first known by this name.

It was customary in both Spain and the New World to dress statues of Mary in the style of Spanish queens. There were few statues of such beauty in New Mexico, and this one became known as the "Queen of the Kingdom of New Mexico and the Villa of Santa Fe." The custom of dressing the statue continues, with colors often coordinated to the liturgical seasons. The faithful sometimes donate jewels and handmade dresses and robes. For the occasion of the Equestrian Order meeting, La Conquistadora is dressed as an EOHSJ dame.

Equestrian Order Information Events



Loving Tribute for a Valiant Knight

Msgr. Francis J. Smith, who was well known as the pastor of St. Raphael Parish for 29 years before retiring in 2015, died Friday morning, January 24th, 2020.

"Our prayers are with the soul of Msgr. Smith. He was a pillar in the church of El Paso and served our diocese with faith and love," Patricia Lopez, chancellor of the Diocese of El Paso, said in an emailed statement. She went on to say, he "always saw God in the people he served."

He was born May 20, 1934, in Chicago and was the grandchild of Eastern European immigrants who came through Ellis Island and were renamed Smith, according to a diocese release. His father, a steelworker, and his mother provided him with a Catholic school education.

Smith was ordained March 25, 1967 and was assigned to the Diocese of El Paso.

He served in several parishes, including St. Joseph Parish as an associate priest, All Saints Parish as pastor, and St. Pius X Parish as pastor. During his service at St. Pius X, he received the honorary title of monsignor.

At St. Raphael, he also oversaw the school and as church pastor baptized, confirmed, and married thousands of El Paso's Catholic faithful.

El Pasoan Rosalie Daw, who knew Smith from the time he was a seminarian, said he was a holy man who also was like a brother and uncle to her family and to many families in El Paso.

"He was a down-to-earth person and one of those guys that was a friend to everyone," she said. Smith baptized all nine of her children and all 32 of her grandchildren and even a few great-grandchildren."

Monsignor Smith also served the diocese as the vicar general and moderator of the curia.

In 2015, Monsignor Smith was honored as the first recipient of the Foundation's Dei Gratia Award during the Ninth Annual Foundation of Faith Dinner. The Dei Gratia Award recognizes people for their servant leadership and outstanding contribution to the Diocese of El Paso and Catholic community.

According to the Foundation, Smith made the crowd laugh when he quoted another Chicago native, Jack Benny, as he accepted his award: "I don't deserve this award, but I have arthritis and I don't deserve that either."


Our El Paso EOHSJ diocesan section will miss him greatly.




